This volunteer has worked in multiple roles alongside fellow team members and staff, providing support to all services that the Care Links program offer. In short, this volunteer has exemplified the Care Links mission, and we are proud to honor Mrs. MaryAlice O'Brien.

Care Links Volunteer in the Spotlight: MaryAlice O'Brien

Mary Alice is the wife of Dan O'Brien, mother, and grandmother. She is a resident of Mechanicville and serves as the Administrative President of the Hemstreet Park Fire Department. MaryAlice has worked most of her life in at Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute and recently retired as the Director of Enterprise Information Services. She enjoys reading, hiking, walking and generally doing anything outdoors.

In February 2004, MaryAlice saw the opportunity to make a difference in the lives of our senior population. While working full time, she focused on volunteering in her free time providing transportation, home visits, light chores, shopping, and reassurance calls with the care receivers. Over the past twenty years, MaryAlice has also given countless hours in her role as a volunteer with care receivers and her generosity with her time, talent and treasure does not go unnoticed by her peers. Her easy smile, upbeat positive attitude, and dedication to helping others within the Care Links family makes her a joy to have on the team.

Upon retirement, MaryAlice added to her service as a Care Links volunteer, joining in with office support, a member of the Special Event Team, Care Links Eagles (a round table discussion group of volunteers focused on the growth of program and volunteer needs), and in addition, has recently added being an "Adopted Grandparent" with Mother Teresa Academy in Halfmoon and their beautiful students (where we promote the development of intergenerational relationships).

Upon hearing that she had been selected as the very first recipient of the <u>CAPTAIN CHS Senior Services</u>, <u>Care Links Volunteer of the Year Award</u>, MaryAlice answered, "I'm honored and excited to be the first recipient of this important award that shows appreciation to volunteers who are the backbone of the program.

The CAPTAIN CHS Senior Services Golden Inspiration Award honors a Care Receiver in the program who has shown countless ways to inspire other seniors to live each moment, reminding them that they each have a purpose while encouraging them to be engaged in the community.

This award is the highest honor a care receiver can receive from the Senior Services program, which means that this care receiver has inspired the Senior Services program to acknowledge the contributions by a care receiver and for the impressive impact that they have made on others in the Senior Services program. We are proud to honor Miss Marilou Pries.

Marilou is a beacon of compassion who is dedicated to caring for others with unwavering dedication and empathy.

Marilou's journey in the realm of caregiving began within the challenging yet rewarding field of pediatrics, where she served as a steadfast pediatric assistant specializing in oncology and hematology. For years, she stood witness to the resilience and courage of countless children battling life-threatening illnesses. She became an important part of many families' immense joys and deepest sorrows, joining them for countless milestones and memorials.

Marilou soon embarked on a new chapter, founding her own business focused on providing hospice and in-home care. In this role, she cultivated deep bonds with both her staff and clients offering support and comfort during some of life's most challenging moments and through this chose to leverage her expertise to consult for the Department of Disability Services, advocating for the rights and wellbeing of individuals.

In 2021, a life altering accident, redirected her journey toward the passionate care provided by Care Links volunteers. What began as a simple request for a ride to a doctor's appointment has led to a collaboration between Marilou and the Senior Services staff. Over the years, she has provided input with her participation at program gatherings, media outlets and volunteer training workshops, entertained us at special events, and shared her story of the impact that Care Links volunteers have had on her life.

Marilou was the very first, "Adopted Grandparent" in collaboration with Mother Teresa Academy, encouraging the relationship between the generations; she has encouraged other care receivers to participate in this important mission. Marilou writes a column in this Care Connection Newsletter and contributes her time as a volunteer within the program by providing reassurance phone calls to other care receivers.

Marilou's ability to make other feel welcome, a fighting spirit to embrace what life throws at her and in sharing her wealth of experience, offering insights gleaned from a career marked by moments of profound connection and empathy led to her becoming the first Care Links Ambassador as the voice for the special seniors in our program. Her compassion and unwavering commitment to the wellbeing of others serve as a beacon of hope and inspiration to all who have the privilege of knowing her and for this reason; it is our honor to present the Senior Services Golden Inspiration Award to Marilou Pries.


