What advice would you give to someone interested in volunteering with the Care Links program?

"My advice to anyone considering volunteering with the Care Links program is that "volunteers are born."

If you feel that you can make a difference in someone's life by giving just a little of your time and talents, the rewards are many. You can even consider it a "pay it forward" act of kindness. One day we will be in the position of a " care receiver" and having someone to visit and care about us would be a blessing."

Anne has been married for 57 years to her college sweetheart, Harry. The two of them have built a life together for their three children and six grandchildren. Ann shares, "I was lucky to have been able to get down on the floor with my grandchildren to play when they were young and have a lot of quality time with them."

Anne has spent a lifetime helping others. She is a past President, District Governor and member of the Shenendehowa Rotary since 1985. Over the years, Anne has traveled to Nigeria to give Polio shots, assisted in providing water systems in Honduras, building a library in Zimbabwe along with hosting foreign exchange students. Anne was also a Board Member for CAPTAIN CHS. Anne has always been a "giver" and now she is on the receiving end, which she admits is not always a comfortable place to be.

Here is Anne's story: "When I called Care Links, it was because I was very lonely. Harry has many places to be and I needed someone who would stop in and keep me company. I need people, I was always so involved in the community and then I found myself not having a way to stay connected as I am no longer able to get around as I once was."

"I contacted Care Links because it had the word "Care" in it. I thought it would be great if someone would come and we could bake together (which I always enjoyed)."

"I was "matched" to Katie and when she walked in with a huge smile on her face, we just hit it off! We have become friends; we are not just volunteer and care receiver. She lifts me up with her positive energy. Seniors need people to check in on them and make sure they are okay. I often think, "What if I fell? Am I okay if they did not hear from me in a while?" This is where Katie makes me feel cared about. Being with Care Links, gives me the opportunity to allow someone else to feel the joy of giving too."

"Many people see a senior and walk away; it is different when you start getting older in the way you are treated. I needed someone and did not know where to turn but am glad I called Care Links and found a way to be involved again in the world."

"My advice to someone who is thinking about calling Care Links is Just Do It! Care Links is about caring and you need someone to care. It took me three times to pick up the phone because it is very hard for me to ask for help. No one really wants to sit in a chair for the rest of their life, which is when you become old and you are as old as you feel."

"Don't give up, don't be embarrassed, just pick up the phone."

Egg Wraps Submitted by Katherine B.

2-3 eggs, scrambled Dash of milk Seasonings of choice Fillings of choice Large flour tortilla ¼ Tbsp butter (optional)

1. In small bowl, scramble eggs with a dash of milk.

2. Add any desired seasonings (I typically use Borsari's original seasoning blend)

3. Scramble in desired fillings (this could be ground sausage, bacon crumbles, veggies, mushrooms, etc. just be careful not to add too many)

4. Using low-medium setting, preheat large frying pan and add butter if desired

- 5. Pour egg & filling mixture into pan
- 6. Lightly press tortilla down ontop of egg mixture
- 7. Let cook for a few minutes

8. Using a large/broad headed spatula, carefully flip the egg and tortilla over (the egg should be adhered to the torilla, but flipping the whole thing over cleanly may take some practice)

9. Let cook for another few minutes until tortilla has crisped

10. Carefully remove from pan and let cool for a couple of minutes until it's cool enough to touch.

11. Roll into a cylinder then cut diagonally across the middle. Enjoy!
