

I am going to open with the words I used to close my last note: "Care Links is amazing, and I am blessed every day to be part of such a great gift to others."

I was watching a movie the other day, and it was about a teacher having challenges with her classroom, she was an English teacher and she was trying to find a way to get their attention. Eventually, she was successful and was able to get them to appreciate stories and poems they never thought they would be able to understand. She quoted the poet Dylan Thomas and spoke at length about his poem, "Do Not Go Gentle Into That Good Night."

I admit that I was never much into poetry in my lifetime but I was intrigued by the way they interpreted it versus how I would at this point in my life.

We each face different challenges and while mine are much different than the teenagers portrayed , they are still scary, and they have a common theme. Every day we are faced with challenges - sometimes it is as simple as getting out of bed. But if I have learned one thing in my life -and the reason I like this poem - is that You must try as hard as you can every single day to reach that for which you are reaching. It could be as easy as creating a menu or preparing a good meal. It could be learning a new card game, like canasta. It could be asking for assistance from someone who might have different abilities than you do. It could even be telling a story - everyone's life story is just a little bit different.

It is putting up your hand and offering help, not always knowing what you could possibly offer but you will not know until you try. It is sharing a part of you, which is what feeds my soul, which is me standing up and raging against the dying of the light. Take a moment and read the poem and rage!
