The 15th Route 50 Mile – June 13, 2024 by Pete Sheridan, Race Director

While I can't guarantee the 2024 version of *The Route 50 Mile* was the best of all time, there is no doubt that this iteration is firmly in the conversation for that title. Three hundred fifty-one runners registered and 321 crossed the finish line. Our timing company, Albany Running Exchange Event Productions, indicated that within their experience, this was an unusually high percentage. Race conditions were perfect, and results seemed to support this contention. Starting the race was Eric Freestone, long time Burnt Hills-Ballston Lake physical education teacher and coach.

In perhaps the best performance of the night, Nicole Moslander of Rotterdam established a new course record for women at 4:53.1, taking down Diane Ryan's 4:55.0 of 2018. Adding frosting to the cake, 36-year-old Nicole was also the women's age-graded champ as well, at 86.87%. Thirty-eight-year-old R50M mainstay Shawn Donegan once again dipped under the 4:20 mark and topped the men's age-graded with a tremendous 90.93. The men's course record withstood all-out assault with four runners under 4:15, led by University at Albany star Jared Rogelski at 4:12.5.

The BH-BL runners awards were taken by Joe Chapman of Gaithersburg, Maryland and current BH-BL cross country/track coach Megan James. Keeping their impressive streaks alive, Carolyn Litynski and Greg Stevens, both of whom have run every race (virtual, too), "laced 'em up" and "got the job done."
